



## SCHOOL BEHAVIOUR POLICY

The community of Woodridge North State School is committed to learning, respect and optimism through secure, supportive and co-operative environment, which recognises and accepts individual differences.

The school encourages a warm, supportive environment where students can be happy and where learning takes place. A major part of the teacher's role is to ensure that children will learn and develop within their school environment without disruptive behaviour hindering their success. It is also expected that students will respect the teacher's fundamental right to teach without disruptive behaviours hindering his/her success.

At Woodridge North State School it is important that children learn to make responsible behaviour choices. To assist with this, we have established a Responsible Thinking Room where the students can go to reflect on their behaviour with a responsible adult to assist them. Every classroom maintains a behaviour management plan that outlines the rules, positive recognition for appropriate behaviour and consequences for inappropriate behaviour. They are:

### Rules

- Follow directions straight away
- Put your hand up, don't call out
- Keep all parts of your body and objects to yourself
- Pay attention to the speaker
- Do not leave the room without permission
- No swearing, teasing or bullying
- No wilful destruction of property

### Positive Recognition

To encourage students to follow these classroom rules, good choices will be recognised with praise and "good news" notes home, as well as individual class and whole school rewards.

### Severe Clause/ Office Referral

Depending on the circumstances a student may advance immediately to a severe clause referral without the teacher using the process steps in between.
